

Injury & Illness Prevention Training for Student Researchers, TA's, Readers and Tutors

Purpose

UC San Diego developed the Injury & Illness Prevention Program (IIPP) in response to a state law that requires safety training for all employees. The program's purpose is to help employees understand and avoid on-the-job risks.

Requirement

All employees must attend an IIPP course once during their career at UCSD. **This includes student employees, graduate students, and visiting scholars who receive compensation from UCSD.**

How to get the training

Attend one of the IIPP courses offered through the UC Learning Center. Sometimes (usually in the fall quarter), a training session will be set up in the department for all new hires. You will be notified by email if that is the case.

About IIPP training

Discussion covers safety issues affecting all campus employees, including:

- An overview of Environment, Health & Safety (EH&S) services and programs
- Hazard awareness and communication
- Fire safety and evacuation procedures
- Emergency Operations Plan and earthquake safety
- Ergonomics resources

Participants receive a Certificate of Completion to be filed with the Lab Safety Coordinator Mike Watson. It's a good idea to make a copy of your certificate to ensure proof of attendance if you transfer to another department at UCSD.

Student employees must complete this training as soon as possible. If this training is not completed, the student will not be hired again until the training is completed and a certificate is on file with the MAE department.
